Catch-up Premium: Coronanvirus 2020-2021 academic year — Ashdon Primary School

Introduction

The government announced £1 billion of funding to support children and young people to catch up lost time after school closure. This is especially important for the most vulnerable and disadvantaged backgrounds. This funding includes:

- a one-off universal £650 million catch up premium for the 2020 to 2021 academic year to ensure that schools have the support they need to help all pupils make up for lost teaching time
- a £350 million National Tutoring Programme to provide additional, targeted support for those children and young people who need the most help

The Catch-up Premium is funded at £80 per pupil (for pupils who were attending at our school in October 2020). Ashdon Primary School had 69 pupils in total last October, so we shall receive £5,520 in total.

We have identified reading, speech & language, maths and mental health as areas requiring Catch-up Premium expenditure.
