I am glad that parents find our Breakfast Club provision useful, so they can get to work earlier than they would be able to if they had to wait for the school to open.

However, this provision is under threat due to parents sending their children without then paying for the time they have used this childcare, despite reminders from our school office staff.

Each time our Breakfast Club makes a loss due to non-payment by parents, then this takes away money from our main budget, which is there to provide every child's education. This is also applicable with non-payment of other things, such as school meals.

As you will know from my communications over the last year, we have had to go through a restructuring and redundancy process, due to the lower level of pupil numbers currently in the school which generates less income from the Government. Therefore, any losses of this kind will put an additional strain on our finances.

I do hope that when reading this, the parents who owe the school money for Breakfast Club and/or school dinners, will settle their debts as soon as possible.
