Curriculum Overview Autumn 1 - Class 3:

English Writing: We are reading 'War Horse' by Michael Morpurgo this term. We will be writing a variety of genres, including diary entries, historical stories and narratives from different characters' perspectives.

English Comprehension: Our comprehension will be sometimes linked to War Horse and sometimes based on texts from CGP comprehension books.

English SPaG: We will be focussing on a range of skills including revising word classes, modal verbs, relative clauses and using parenthesis.

<u>Mathematics</u>: Place value (understanding 6 and 7 digit numbers), using the four operations and fractions, decimals and percentages. Class 3 will also do regular 20-minute Arithmetic sessions.

<u>Science</u>: Living Things and their Habitats - including both plants and animals.

Geography: There will be elements of Geography in our History based topic, such as identifying key locations from WWI and WWII on world maps.

<u>History</u>: World at War - elements of WWI and WWII <u>Art and D.T:</u> Picasso and Degenerative Art (linked to

WWII) and Designing a Slipper

RSE: Families and Relationships

P.E: Cricket and Swimming

<u>R.E:</u> Philosophy - Is believing in God reasonable?

Music: Music through WWII and seasonal music such as Harvest and Christmas

<u>Handwriting</u>: Daily practice focussing on cursive letter formation and joining our letters correctly. We will also use handwriting time to practise key spellings





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RE: Educational Visits and Transport to Sporting Events

Dear Parents and Carers,

I am writing to you today about voluntary contributions towards educational visits. Even though we make the most of our local environment and take our pupils on exploration walks and short visits to places of interest in our local area, there are times when we want to invite professionals in, or take our pupils further afield to expose them to as many experiences as possible (and have fun learning). We also want them to partake in sporting events in the local area – something that they have not been part of for a while, as I understand.

As we have very limited places to visit in Ashdon, due to the more rural location, we sometimes must look at places that require us to book transport there and back; this includes sporting events. This adds a great amount to the cost of any educational visit, as you can imagine. We do not want to let this hinder the chances of our pupils gaining the experiences that could make learning new skills and competing in sporting events even more enjoyable.

In addition to these events further away from Ashdon, we also have professionals visiting our school, exposing our pupils to aspects in their learning that comes 'alive' as a result. I have never seen our pupils bored or disinterested during any of these educational events – just ask Class 2 and 3 about their cricket lessons this week with Mr. Scott!!

This brings me to my point: Parents and carers have been asked in the past to make a voluntary contribution towards the cost of some trips to cover the cost of transport and other expenses incurred in providing an education/experiences from other professionals (inside or outside school), but which still take place during school hours. We have, as a school, tried to keep parental contributions as low as possible. However, this is becoming increasingly difficult in the current economic circumstances. Along with this, the cost of transport to attend sporting events is astronomical, to say the least.

We are living through a cost of living crisis which affects everyone, and school budgets are affected too. However, it is important for our children to benefit from all the many and varied experiences on offer, regardless of Ashdon being a small school in a rural area.

I am aware that these are voluntary contributions, and therefore I want to implore all parents and carers to please see where you could possibly help towards payments for your child's educational visits and additional learning experiences or possibly offer to help with transporting your children, if they're in sports teams, to local events. This would be <u>greatly</u> appreciated.

Unfortunately, booked educational visits may be affected if a significant amount of the cost is not collected. The school would then have to consider cancelling some trips, as we simply cannot afford to subsidise these events. Should financing a trip be an issue for you, please do not hesitate to contact the school as there may be something we can do to help support you with this.
