



RE: Routines at School

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are working really hard on following instructions as well as transitioning into, and out of, school. We are also practising transitioning (walking) around the school. In order to do this really well, we have been practising these transitions with our pupils, and they all are trying incredibly hard to do this. One of these days we have 100% of them doing it. :-)

Part of the rationale behind this is to ensure that we do not waste learning time and make sure our pupils settle into class and their lessons really quickly.

You might have seen last term that I used 'non-verbals' with the pupils (showing 1, 2 and 3 with my fingers), instructing them to stand, line up, sit and transition to and from class. Make sure you ask your child about this, as they will give you more details or even a demonstration!

This brings me to my next point: Transitions into school in the morning.

We would like for us all to adhere to the following please:

Playground in the morning:

The whistle will blow at 09:00 and pupils will line up immediately.

Pupils, parents and staff will all be expected to be silent (we as adults model that, we are also following the rules) When the whistle blows at 09:00, parents must make their way to the gate immediately please. You can use both gates to exit; however, the gate near the library will close at 09:05 promptly.

If your child is late, after 09:00, please take them to the front office.

The register closes at 09:10 and if your child arrives after that, they will be marked in as late.

Dismissal in the courtyard:

All pupils must wait with their teacher and say 'goodbye' before they can go to their parents/person collecting them—we just want to make sure that our pupils are safe and that they are indeed collected by the correct person. This means that pupils will not be able to just run off to parents.

Assemblies on Friday:

We appreciate it so incredibly mush when our parents/carers join us for our assemblies. The staff and children absolutely love showing everyone their lovely work and what they have learned. The audience has been so respectful and attentive when pupils presented their work and we are grateful for that. A slight change to how we used to do things: We want to ask that parents and carers are silent once they see the first pupil walk into the hall. We would be so grateful if all adults in the hall could help us with modelling 'being silent' to our pupils.

I want to thank each and every parent/carer/family member in advance for helping our pupils with this.
